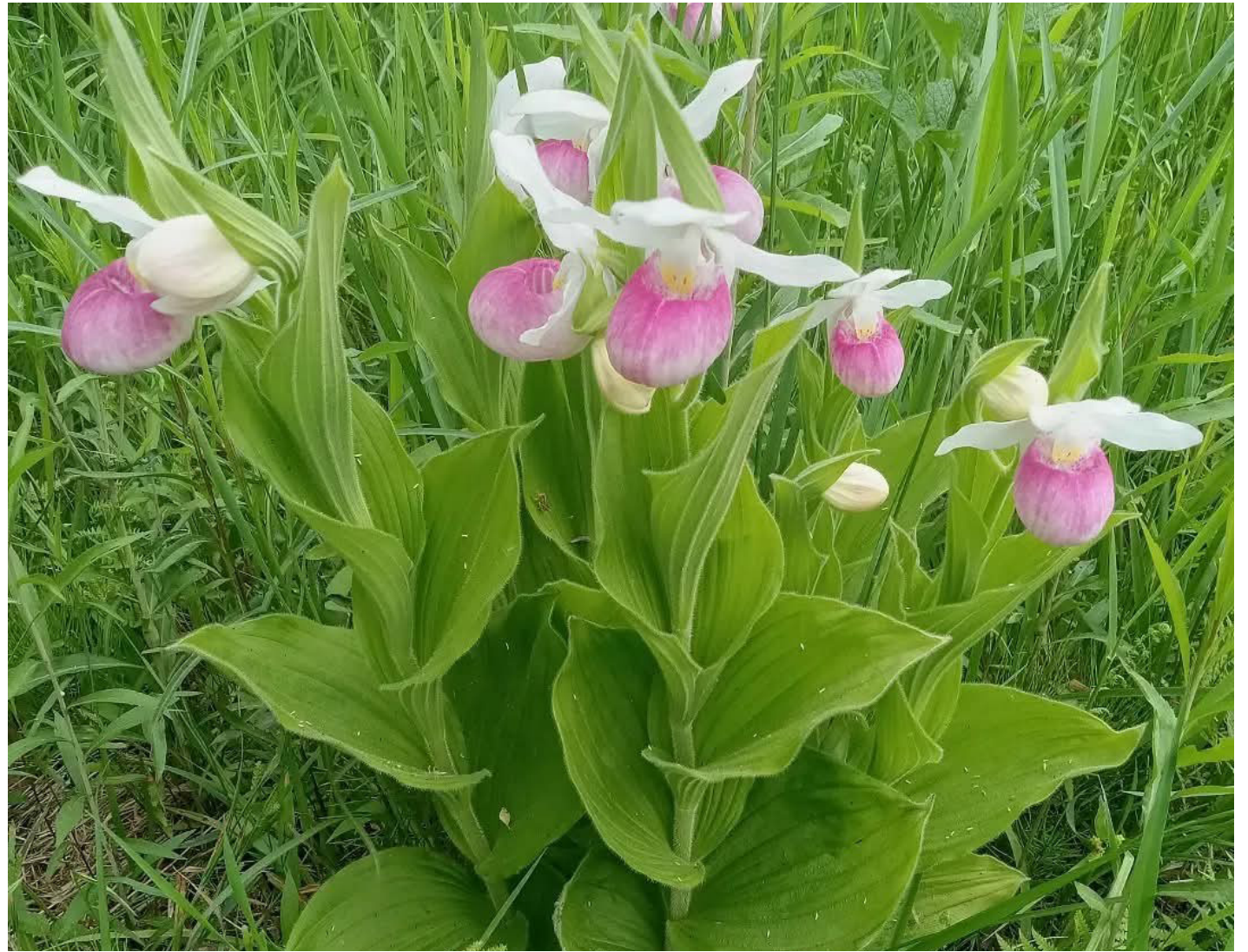

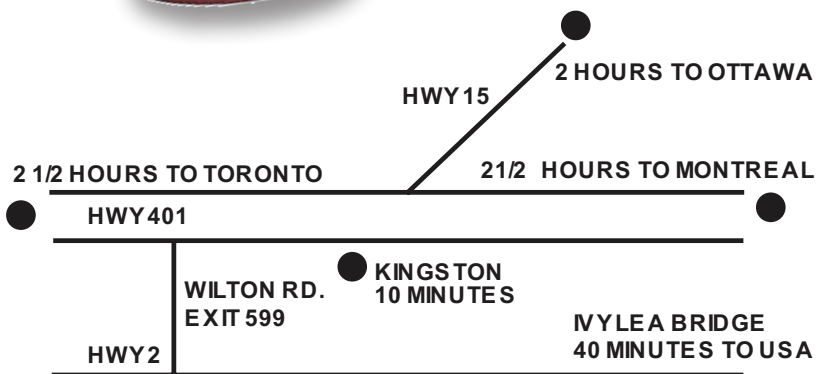

In an online post I dared to voice my opinion, disagreeing with this project. In my opinion, I felt that money would be better spent to start scholar-



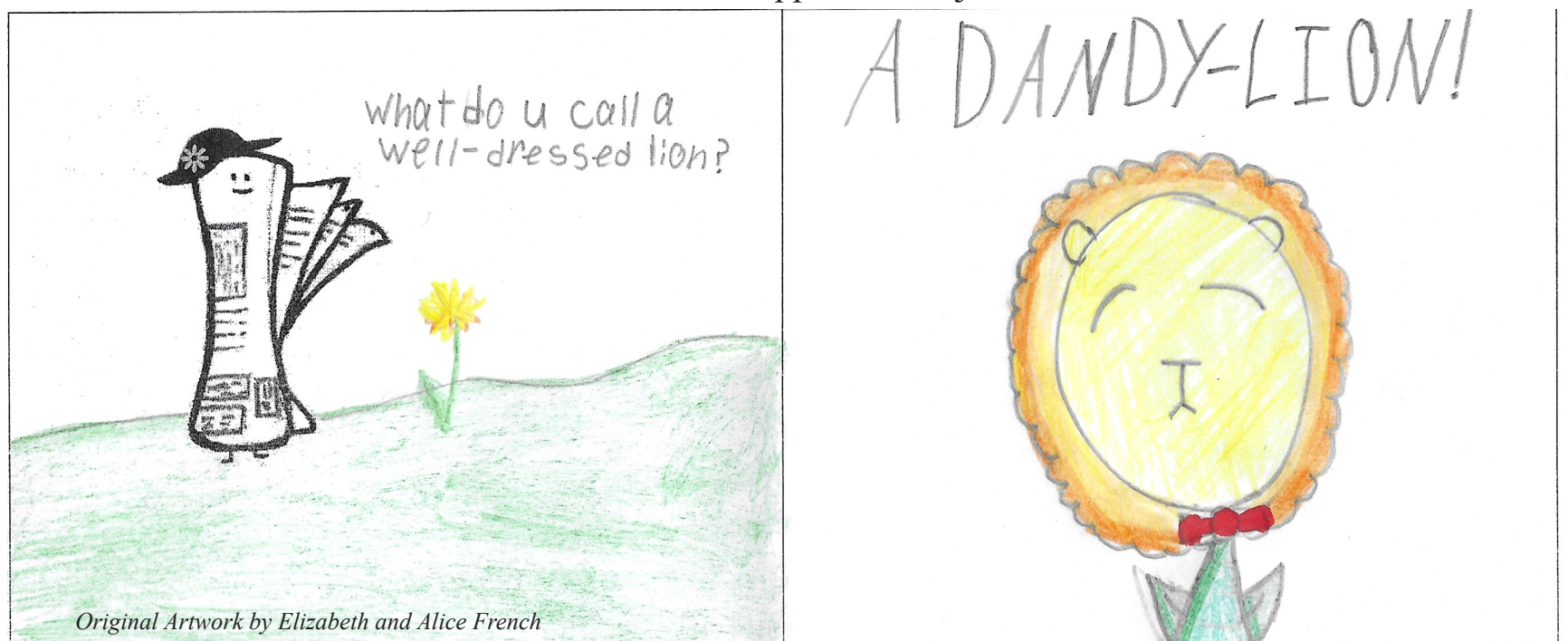

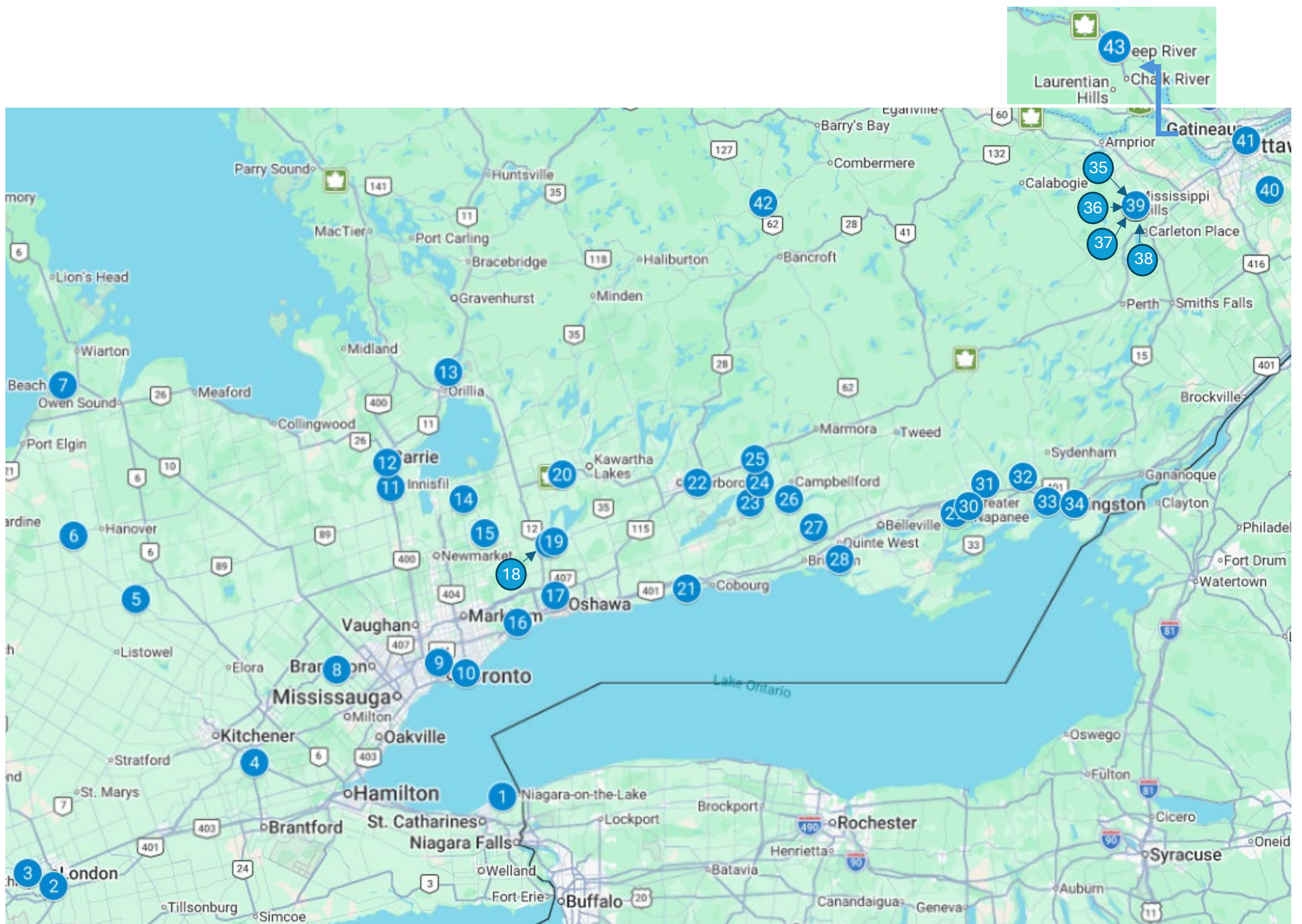

Let's Talk Comics By Rob Lamberti

Comics have many enemies.

Water, humidity, sunlight, bugs and grubby little hands that wrinkle, bend and muck up the pages. Some readers tear out poster pages from them. And others cut out the Marvel Value Stamps that were included in its comics between 1974 and '76.

All of that reduces the collectability and value of comic books. Nevertheless, there is demand among collectors for specific individual comic pages from key issues and incomplete key issues that are missing a chunk, or a page or two.

First, a bit of background here: It's important to care for the books, especially older books, which are susceptible to the environment. The first comics were printed on the cheapest newsprint available. During prohibition, the paper was sometimes a cover for a booze shipment from Canada.

Bagging and boarding them is the minimum level of protection to prevent degradation. There are higher-grade bags, such as Mylites and Mylar, archival acid-free boards, and acid-free sheets to insert between pages, which offer the best protection.

Another option includes the encapsulating and grading of books, commonly known as slabbing. A third-party appraiser grades the book on a scale of 10 and then places it in a sealed plastic sleeve. It is a potentially costly and time-consuming process.

Before slabbing, damaged books were treated as trash or as a reader's copy, to be handled without the care or reverence they deserve.

That's changed in some cases, though.

There's a market for partial books and single pages, but it is very specific to key books or key eras, such as the Platinum Age, roughly between 1897 and 1937, and the Golden Age, 1938 to 1956. This would not apply to books of low value or low demand.

In a recent auction, a slabbed page from Amazing Fantasy 15, the first appearance of Spi-

der-Man, sold for US\$105.50. That's a great sale for a page, but the thing is that it was an ad page. There's no artwork: ads on the front, ads on the back. Not a bad return for something that high lighted live seahorses and learning how to dance on one side, and a full-page ad for novelty items.

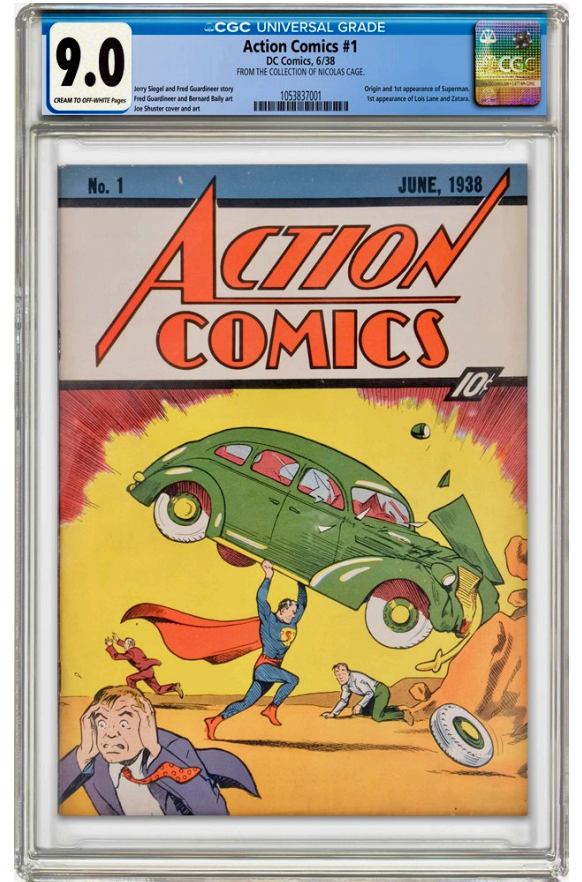


There were other individual pages from AF 15 for sale at this auction as well, but they included artwork and sold for more than the ad page. Expect to see slabbed individual pages, including covers, up for sale more often from incomplete key books or runs, such as Golden Age Captain America Comics (1941 to '54).



Comics that aren't slabbed, also known as raw, and are incomplete would most likely be graded as poor, valued at best at about five per cent of the mint price. Slabbing them would get the maximum return on a damaged book. But before slabbing a damaged book, always get a second opinion from a seasoned comic book collector or dealer.

No sooner than a new sales record of US\$9.2 was set by a 9.0 graded Superman 1 last November in a Heritage Auctions sale, Metropolis/Comic Connect of New York City was involved in the private sale of a 9.0 graded Action 1 in January for — drum roll, please — \$15 million. It is now the highest-priced collectible, beating Mickey Mantle's 1952 Topps card, which sold for \$12.6 million in 2022.



The book, which had a print run of about 200,000, marks the first appearance of Superman in 1938. It is estimated that fewer than 100 currently exist. This book is THE key comic of the hobby. It was the first appearance of Superman and introduced the concept of a superhero with otherworldly superpowers.

This individual issue also has quite a history. Actor Nicolas Cage once owned the copy, one of two graded that high. It was stolen from his L.A. home in 2000 and was recovered 11 years later in San Fernando Valley following an abandoned storage locker auction.

The anonymous buyer then contacted Mark Balelo, he of Storage Wars fame, and in turn contacted Metropolis Comics in New York City. It was recognized as the stolen book, and an undercover police officer who attended a meeting with Balelo and the buyer recovered the holy grail and returned it to the actor.

Cage later auctioned the recovered book for \$2.16 million.

Superman creators Jerry Siegel and Toronto-born Joe Shuster were paid a total of \$130 for the rights to the character. It took several lawsuits over the decades for the duo and their families to get some of what they should have from DC Comics.

Last Minute Treats from Postcard Publishers

For the past eight months or so I've been putting together a new handbook on the postcards by Toronto publisher Nerlich & Co. with my friend and co-author Robert Montpetit. Whether I'm co-authoring a handbook, or going solo, the goal is the same – have it ready to launch at the annual Toronto Postcard Club (TPC) Show in February. Over the years, launching a new handbook at the TPC Show has become as important to me as the Christmas season is to retailers.

So by the middle of January, I have to stop recording new additions and get everything ready for the printer. More often than not, just when I think I can wrap things up, new arrivals show up at the 11th hour via email from my cross-Canada collector network. In this *Wayback Times* article then, I'm going to showcase some wonderful postcard treats that made it into my handbooks in the nick of time.

I might as well start with Nerlich & Co. Just when I thought the handbook was finished, a collector in Delta, BC sent me an image of a Toronto view card that I'd never seen before (see Figure 1). When I checked with other collectors in the TPC, I learned that the card wasn't necessarily scarce but I'm convinced it's unique to Nerlich & Co. And I've certainly catalogued a huge amount of Toronto view cards over the years.

One of the pleasant surprises that came to light while putting together the T. J. Pugh postcard handbook last year was the number of mass-produced real photo postcards (RPPCs) that Pugh ordered from England's Rotary Photo Co. Unlike locally-produced RPPCs, which were usually made by photographers in their studios, a few large firms such as Rotary Photo machine-printed them by the millions using a process originally developed in 1886 by Scotsman John Urie.

Regardless of the process, all of Pugh's mass-produced RPPCs have the same basic (rectangular) design except one of Amherstburg, Ontario that turned up at the last minute (see Figure 2). This particular RPPC was not only a johnny-come-lately, it's the only one with an oval view, a seashore motif and "Greetings From" as part of the caption.

Right before I converted my 2024 Rumsey & Co. handbook into a portable document format (PDF) file for transmission to my go-to printer in London, Ontario, I got a phone call from Hamilton dealer-collector Jon Soyka, former president of the Golden Horseshoe

Post Card Club. Soyka and I have known each other for years and he's a frequent contributor of postcards to my handbooks. He told me that he had a rather unusual Rumsey & Co. ad card that deserved to be catalogued. I told him to email me images of the front and back and I'd squeeze it in some-

how. Well, I was certainly surprised when the images arrived. What Soyka had was not a postcard or even a trade card (see Figure 3).



My guess is that it was meant for the top of a Rumsey & Co. postcard rack in a store. Whatever its original purpose, I thought it was cool enough to find a place in one of the appendices at the back of the handbook. And the story gets even better. When Soyka came over to my book table at the 2024 TPC Show, he kindly gave me this display ad as a gift. Needless to say, it has pride of place in my Rumsey & Co. postcard album.

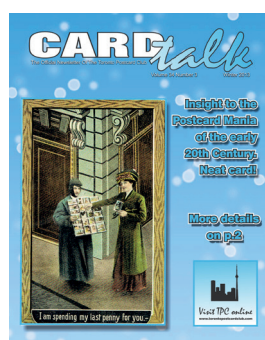
Without a doubt, my intrepid editor Roger Miller has pulled more rabbits out of his hat when it comes to last minute postcard treats than any other collector I know. Miller has uncanny internet skills and regularly comes up with amazing postcard finds online. His help with my 2022 W. G. MacFarlane handbook is a great example. With time running

out before I went to press, Miller found an ad in an online copy of the April 1908 issue of *Canadian Druggist* announcing the release of a brand new MacFarlane fancy view card series. Incredibly, even with the MacFarlane handbook in its third edition by 2022, cards from this series had never been recorded. When I asked Miller to use all his "magic powers" to find me some examples to catalogue, he succeeded as usual (see Figure 4).

Coins of Newfoundland By Ian Brimble

It is common for most Canadian coin collectors to have coins in their collection from Newfoundland. However, some may be unfamiliar with the history of Newfoundland and how it contributed to the rich numismatic history of our nation. We are fortunate in Canada to have a numismatic history that parallels that of our nation's history, and as such, the coins of Newfoundland are a product of our national heritage.

Newfoundland, as any good student of Canadian history will tell you, did not join Confederation until 1949, making it the last addition until Nunavut joined Canada in 1999. As such, it has a history that is distinct from the rest of the provinces and territories, and it produced its own coinage from 1865 until the last Newfoundland penny was produced in 1947. It is this history that makes Newfoundland coin collecting such an interesting and unique element of most Canadian coin collectors.

When Newfoundland started producing its coins, the year was 1865 and the production included the penny, 5 cent, 10 cent, 20 cent (later to become the 25 cent) and in 1870, the 50 cent piece. Perhaps the most interesting release of 1865, which was unique to Newfoundland; the 2 dollar gold coin series which ran until 1888. These coins remain highly collectable within the Canadian coin collecting community the world over. It has gained particular appeal lately with the sharp rise in gold prices, at nearly 1/10 ounce, the base metal value of these coins is significant today.

In the year 1865, Newfoundland began to produce its own currency (actually starting in 1864 with the penny). Newfoundland had rejected invitations to join Confederation as there was a sizable anti-confederate movement on the island at that time. As such, Newfoundland was working to be as independent as possible, and being a self-governing colony at that time allowed it the opportunity to produce its own currency. However, Newfoundland in the mid 1800s lacked the equipment needed to produce coins and, as such, they had their coins produced in Britain, similar to the Dominion of Canada of the day.

Prior to the first World War, all coins were produced in Britain by the Royal Mint. Coins produced by the Royal Mint in the Newfoundland series can be identified with the absence of a mint mark. (Figure 1)

During several years, production was moved from the Royal Mint to the Birmingham Mint which was owned by Ralph Heaton and Sons. Coins produced in the Birmingham Mint have the "H" mint mark. Figure 2 below illustrates the Heaton mint mark below the date. This mark is often found on early Canadian coins produced at the Birmingham Mint as well.

During the first world war, production of coins for Newfoundland was primarily moved to the Royal Canadian Mint in Ottawa. This was done to avoid transiting significant values across the Atlantic at considerable risk during the war years. Coins produced in Ottawa were given the "C" mint mark to denote their production location (See Figure 3). Interestingly, the government of Canada convinced the Newfoundland government to switch the denomination from 20 to 25 cents as Newfoundland coins often circulated

within Canada and the similar size and appearance of the 20 cent created confusion.

After the first world war, most production of Newfoundland coins remained the responsibility of the Royal Canadian Mint in Ottawa, with some coins produced in the late 1930s and 1940s remaining with the Royal Mint in London.

Throughout their production, Newfoundland coins have attracted collectors of all types. It is often a challenge to obtain many Newfoundland Victorian coins due to the limited production of these dates when compared to the Canadian production of coins at that time. As an example, in the year 1870, Newfoundland produced 30,000 ten cent coins compared to the Canadian production of 1.6 million that same year. As a result, the collector value of early Newfoundland denominations tends to be higher than their Canadian counterparts. It is this element that makes collection of Newfoundland coins such an appealing undertaking for many collectors as many dates can be elusive rarities, particularly in higher quality examples.
